## **Hmong Ministry**

The Hmong become members of the parish in the early eighties. We have over a hundred Hmong parishioners. In the early nineties, the Human Concerns Commission established a Hmong Task Force which eventually became a commission of the Parish Council. The Commission helps the parish to respond to the special needs of our Hmong parishioners and to help them to share their gifts with the community. Mass in Hmong is celebrated on the thirds Sunday of the month. There is an adult Small Community of Faith in Hmong and an annual retreat day for Hmong adults and youth. Special mailings that are sent to all parishioners are translated into Hmong by members of the commission. Hmong children grow up learning Hmong and English and the adult members of the community are insuring that they do not neglect to learn to read and write in Hmong. 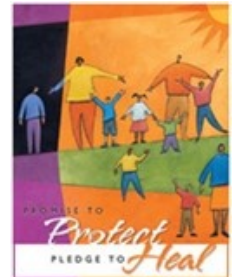
